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## CONSIDER THE DARKNESS

Advent is a season of preparation culminating in the celebration heralded by angelic proclamation, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord." (Luke 2: 10b-11)

Fulfilling Isaiah's prophecy, "The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned." (Isa. 9:2) Jesus declared, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." (John 8:12)

Consider for a moment the darkness.

Before the birth of Jesus of Nazareth, people walked in

darkness . . . deep spiritual darkness. Four hundred years scholars tell us. Four centuries of heavenly silence and seemingly divine absence.

My first office as a new member of the staff at Briercrest Seminary was at the end of a hall off Faculty row, with no exterior windows. I recall the first time the power went out during a counselling session with a student. What we experienced was the darkness that hides one's hand positioned centimeters from your face. Pitch black. Zero visibility.

Imagine if you will, this physical absence of light as a metaphor for the experience of the spiritual darkness of that first Advent. God, who up to that point had been so prominent in the storied history of the nation of Israel, silent . . . absent . . . no 'unchanging grace' upon which to rest.

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Struggle, uncertainty, alone, abandoned, without anchor in the 'high and stormy gales.'

Yes, consider the darkness.

We remember the culmination of the story to our peril. Advent invites pause; an interruption to the off frenzied pace thrusting us headlong to the resolve of Christmas morning. Advent is counter. It is birthed in darkness. 'Tis the season of waiting . . . when all through the heavens not a Creator was stirring . . . Advent begins as a season of walking in ambiguity and insecurity.

As surely as dusk is followed by physical darkness, so too for those of us 'living in the land," darkness will inevitably cast its shadow across our hearts and lives. Heartache, loss, loneliness, and uncertainty will come like an eclipse, blinding us to the Light.

In seasons of darkness the Psalmist lamented, "Why, Lord, do you reject me and hide your face from me?" John the Baptizer articulated his experience of the darkness in a question . . . "Are you the one to come or should we expect another." The Apostle Paul "under great pressure, far beyond [the] ability to endure . . . despaired of life itself," as the darkness crashed in on the shores of his weary soul. Jesus in his darkest moment cried out My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

Darkness, in one form or another, touches all of our lives.

AND . . . it is into the darkness that the One who would later declare himself, the Light of the world, was born. A popular Christmas song captures the longing of our hearts, "We pray in hope, please hear our cry, or is the story just a lie? We need the child to show the way. Come now, be born in us today." Jesus comes to us, he enters our darkness. The Good Shepherd joins us in the darkest valleys. His presence, our comfort. More than this, of Jesus presence in his personal struggle a ministry colleague recently wrote . . . "This is the closest I get to feeling intimacy in my relationship with Christ."

I was recently introduced to the song, Yet Not I but Through Christ in Me . . .

The night is dark but I am not forsaken For by my side, the Saviour He will stay I labour on in weakness and rejoicing For in my need, His power is displayed

To this I hold, my Shepherd will defend me Through the deepest valley He will lead Oh the night has been won, and I shall overcome Yet not I, but through Christ in me

As we embark on the mystery of Advent through the themes of hope, peace, love, and joy, may we consider the darkness into which Immanuel came then ... and now comes to be present with us.

#### THE YEAR THAT WAS
